The companies will be featured at TAG's annual Georgia Technology Summit, to be held on March 24, 2010, at Cobb Galleria Center. This year's Summit will feature a keynote presentation by Carlos Dominguez, senior vice president in Cisco's Office of the Chairman of the Board and CEO. Dominguez joins an all star lineup that includes keynote Tom Koulopoulos, author of *The Innovation Zone: How Great Companies Re-Innovate for Amazing Success* and the founder of Delphi Group, a prominent and well respected global consulting firm and Bert Ellis, partner of Ellis, McQuary & Stanley and active entrepreneur in the median and technology industries. Prior speakers include Thomas Friedman, Ted Turner, and Steve Ballmer.

The Top 40 winners were selected from numerous applicants from across the State. The Top 40 competition recognizes Georgia technology companies with the most innovative, disruptive and breakthrough technologies. The Top 40 winners will participate in a showcase at the Georgia Technology Summit, expected to draw over 1,000 leaders from the state's technology community.

"In just a few years, the Top 40 Innovators has become a major part of the Georgia technology community," said Tino Mantella, president of TAG. "We are looking forward to again having the privilege to shine the spotlight on some the state's most creative companies."
