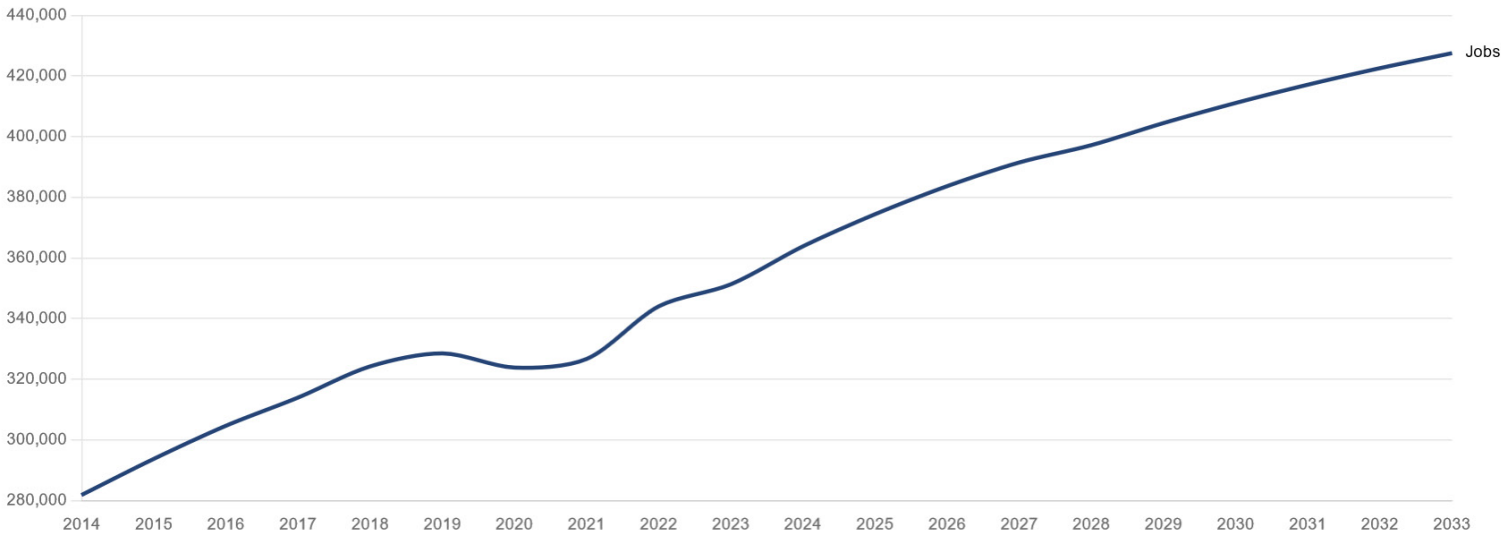

Did You Know?

The Peach State is home to a robust and diverse technology sector, which serves as a vital component to the state's overall economic growth.

- + Technology enterprises contribute **\$34 billion** to the Gross Regional Product (up 35% since 2019).
- + More than *18,000* technology companies call Georgia home employing a tech industry workforce.
- + The state is **6th in nation** in net tech employment jobs added and is 1st in the nation for the diversity index quartile. This growth is significantly stronger than the national average.

Impact by Industry

Cybersecurity

Cybersecurity organizations in Georgia generate more than \$5 billion in annual revenue. **More than 150 cybersecurity companies** call Georgia home, and we continue to be a leader protecting the interests and security of companies worldwide.

The National Technology Security Council (NTSC), a TAG sister organization, launched a global event series of roundtables including Atlanta, Washington D.C., San Francisco, and London.

TAG also supports the ongoing efforts of The Georgia Cyber Innovation & Training Center in Augusta, and partners with the Cyber Risk Alliance and ISACA Atlanta chapter to offer CPE credits to information security professionals.

Digital Health

Georgia is one of the top states in the nation in digital health technology with approximately 30,000 jobs.

There are 490 companies in the TAG Digital Health Ecosystem, with an estimated \$12 billion in revenue.

In 2024, the TAG Digital Health Society partnered with the Georgia HIMSS chapter for a day at the Capitol including meeting Governor Kemp and the First Lady.

Financial Technology

Nearly 120 billion payment transactions and roughly 70% of all global payments and FinTech industry transactions in the country are processed in Georgia's "Transaction Alley" which comprises more than 200 financial-processing companies.

The top 50 Georgia-based FinTech companies generate annual revenue of more than \$72 billion, with 6 of the 10 largest US payment processing firms being headquartered in the state.

More than 30,000 professionals in Georgia (and over 130,000 globally) are employed by Georgia-based FinTech firms. These companies process more than 118 billion transactions (over \$2 trillion) supporting nearly 4 million merchants.

Pathways to Leadership

2023 brought the second cohort of TAG's Pathways to Leadership Program. Pathways to Leadership provides a unique opportunity for ambitious young professionals to learn directly from industry experts and executives. For these future C-Suite professionals and TAG leaders, this program doubles as a valuable learning experience and a diverse networking opportunity.

In its second year, the Pathways to Leadership program enjoyed a number of milestones:

- Fifteen people participated in the year-long Pathways to Leadership curriculum
- 5 members of the cohort were promoted
- The cohort experienced 70 hours of learning, reviewed and implemented 30 different Leadership Frameworks, established or enhanced 1000 relationships, and enjoyed over 100 hours of consulting.

TAG's Government Relations team is committed to representing our community's interests, by carefully considering legislation and providing policy feedback, seeking funding for workforce development throughout the state, advocating for computer science education, and being your voice for issues and policies that affect the technology sector.

Bridge Builders is a Social Justice & Equity initiative designed to bring the technology and business community together to drive change.

In early 2024, TAG launched Georgia's first Registered Technology Apprenticeship Program to help reskill and upskill our workforce.
